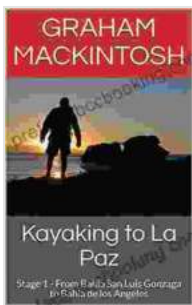


Stage From Bahia San Luis Gonzaga To Bahia De Los Angeles

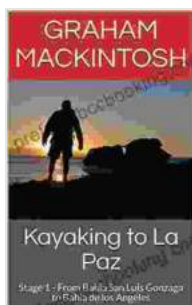
